A. Educational Programs

3040 Community Services

It is the Policy of the Governing Board that Monterey Peninsula College should be a major cultural resource for the community

In addition to its formal <u>As part of its</u> curricula and programs, the College will strive to enhance cultural and personal enrichment opportunities for <u>citizens of the Districthe community</u> by offering to them, through <u>the a</u> Community Services <u>Departmentprogram</u>, a varied <u>program schedule</u> of short-courses, concerts, speakers, films, and other activities of the highest possible quality and merit.

The community services program shall be designed to contribute to the physical, mental, economic and/or civic development of the individuals or groups enrolled in it.

Community services courses shall be open for admission of adults and of minors who can benefit from the programs.

<u>Community Services programs and activities shall be supported by fees charged for each program or</u> activity not to exceed the cost of maintaining the courses. These courses may also be offered for remuneration by contract or with contributions or donations of individuals or groups. No General Fund monies shall be expended to establish or maintain these courses.

Community Services programs and activities shall be supported by fees and District funds, but no state general funds shall be used for direct costs and direct support costs of the program.
