Residential Drug Treatment Programs

 - Private non-profit alcohol and drug treatment facility with residential, relapse, day and evening outpatient treatment programs. Twenty-two beds. Services are for men and women over age 18. The residential program is up to 90 days long. No children. A variety of after-care and family support services are offered on-site. Reimbursement through private insurance or self-pay.

 - Christian-based residential facility for men (22 beds) with substance abuse problems who want to change their life. Residents must make a 12-month commitment to the program. • Residential drug treatment for women, ages 18-64. Fourteen beds. Length of stay ranges from 3-6 months. Provides alcohol/drug education, individual/group counseling, after-care counseling, outpatient services, and referrals to other community programs. Pregnant women accepted. No children. Reimbursement from public funding and self-pay.

• State-licensed residential treatment program for adults and pregnant and parenting mothers accompanied by young children, ages 0-5. Services include individual assessment, treatment planning, medical services, medically-supervised detoxification, individual and group counseling, and relapse prevention. Co-ed program has 28 beds for a 3-6 month stay. The perinatal program has 8 beds for women with children for a stay of 4-6 months. Reimbursement through private pay and sliding fee scale.

 - Self-supporting, transitional housing for adult men who have graduated from a primary recovery program. Housing for 53 men. Must be 30 days clean and sober. Must be employed or have some means of support. This is a social model of recovery. A variety of supportive services are available. Men may stay up to two years.
