There are six important ways we use prepositional phrases

- To give more information about an action (as a modifier to a verb):
 sleep throughout the winter
 danced atop the tables for hours
- 2) To give more information about a thing or person (as a modifier to a noun): the weather in May cheese from France with live bacteria

3) As the object, or complement, of a verb insist on staying home dispose of unwanted items

- 4) To specify a noun, as the complement of that noun a **thirst** for revenge an **amendment** to the constitution
- 5) As the complement of an adjective or adverb attentive to their needs separately from its neighbors

- 6) As the complement of another preposition until after supper from beneath the bed
