- Community of Caring Monterey Peninsula, College Challenge on June 28: MPC Upward Bound
 hosted about 100 fourth grade students from King Elementary School in Seaside. The day
 included rally event, hand-on interactive activity, campus tour, and student panel (consisting of
 current college students and college graduates). Positive coverage of event on KSBW and
 Herald.
- Outreach Activity at Naval Postgraduate School on July 16, 2013: The event at NPS was intended to let service members and their families learn about the different activities, services, and schools offered to them in the greater Monterey area. A range of organizations/ companies were present; from area schools (private and public) for the young children of service persons, to higher education (MPC and MIIS) directed at older dependents and spouses. There were also various hotels/inns in attendance, along with churches, martial arts companies, and rock climbing companies, to name a few.
- MPC hosted the Imagine College Symposium on July 12, 2013: The target participants are recent Seaside High School graduates slated to attend college this coming fall. The majority plan to attend MPC, but others may attend CSU, UC or private schools. About 25 students attended. Imagine College is based at Seaside High School and is a public/private partnership offering Seaside High School students educational enrichment opportunities throughout the year which culminates in a \$4,000 scholarship for Seaside High School graduates who have attended all four years at Seaside and participated in Imagine College sponsored educational enrichment opportunities. The Imagine College Symposium hosted by MPC is one of those activities.
- TRiO Jam Day on July 13, 2013: Approximately 130 high school students participating in MPC's
 Upward Bound and Math Science Upward Bound programs held a day-long event that included
 athletic and academic activities. The day culminated in a talent show that showcased the song,
 dance, and artistic talents of our Upward Bound participants.
- Math Upward Bound: Their summer program at UC Santa Cruz closed last Saturday with a science fair and an award banquet for the 50 students enrolled in the program coming from across the Western states.
- Upward Bound: This program also completed the summer sessions with an award banquet at the College Center for 60 local high school students.

Financial Aid News:

- New for 2013-14: Students are now able to submit the four required forms for financial aid electronically. If not selected for further verification by the Department of Education, students receive financial aid much faster.
- Financial Aid completed a total of 498 files as of 7-15-13 for the 13-14 school year, compared to 1,806 files in the 12-13 school year.

A total of 5,845 FAFSA applications for 2013-14 have been submitted, compared to 8,127 for 2012-13.
