































Ethnicity categories changed in 2009 -- No review of Ethnicity in today's presentation
























Digging deeper into Completion Rates



Students can achieve Completion by:

- Earning an AA/AS
- Earning a Certificate
- Obtaining "Transfer Prepared" status (60 units transferable to UC/CSU)
- Transferring to a 4-year institution








Scorecard Completion metric: Earned Certificate



Scorecard Completion: Achieved Transfer Prepared Status, Prepared vs. Unprepared











Transfer to a 4-Year: Does Economic Status matter?
