All documents are available in the Links section of Curricunet.</p> <p>Looking at the Guiding Notes, on page 32 in the Physical Activity section, it looks like these courses should be approved. He Seon mentioned that PE courses are approved by the CSU system based on the Guiding Notes and the CSU-GE Standards.</p> <p>There was discussion of the number of units required. GE requires 3 units in area E, but not all can be PE courses. We need to see if it still qualifies for B2 and 5B, but we are not sure if it qualifies as Lifelong Learning. Group reviewed Guiding Notes. Fred asked if this course discusses relationships with the environment. There is lecture content that seems to cover this area, such as environment laws, the effects of the older population, etc... He Seon pointed out three areas of inquiry (Sociological, Physiological, Psychological) in area E and if the course doesn't cover all three areas, approval will be denied. This point can be argued, however. Lynn noted that the course needs to discuss more than a few years of a human lifespan, it needs to cover the entire life. Rachel discussed how Psychological components maybe a stretch but could work. He Seon noted behavior could be considered Psychological. Requesting Review Again:
CSU-GE Area C2 – Humanities

This course has a pending version and an active version in Curricunet. The group decided to review the active course since the pending course won't be in effect until Fall 2017.

Michael noted that this course is being revised for realignment with C-ID. He Seon noted that this course has not been reviewed since 1995. We need to see if it still meets the requirements for C2.

Fred noted that Guiding Notes, page 24, the third arrow says "Courses in mass communication or mass media are seldom accepted in Area 3B or C2. (However, courses that study the interaction of mass communication and society are often appropriate for social studies.)" Should we consider this in Social Sciences area D instead?

GER denied it previously – He Seon.

LaRon was concerned how this would affect students that use this course to meet the C2 requirement and asked what changes were made to remove this course from C2. Fred said maybe it shouldn't have been for C2 originally. The Guiding Notes didn't exist in 1995 so the process is evolving.

Gamble would like to deny C2 and assign to D. He Seon said that area D requires that "students will learn how to practice social science" and this may be a problem.

Fred said we could change the SLOs to work better for area D. Content is a list of industries. Content, outcomes and objectives are not well integrated in some courses and this course is an example of that problem.

In reviewing the course Lynn asked if the literature studied is seminal or canonical as stated in the requirements in the Guiding Notes... Catherine noted that a lot of the course discusses gender through culture. This course is a discussion of culture, not canonical or seminal literature. The course would cover the subjective experience which is the third item listed in 3B Humanities from the Guiding Notes document.</p> <p>LaRon noted that this course is listed as Social Science and discussed if need to look at this as well. We approved it for Social Science recently.</p> <p>We reviewed the IGETC Standards document – page 19 specifically.</p> <p>Gamble says we should not approve this course for 3B.</p> <p>Fred asked how this will affect MPC GE. He Seon said it will be looked at in April. The course will be reviewed again then because it had a substantial revision.
