Discussion Agenda	Fred discussed how we are adding BRCT as a second discipline to ETNC 6 and THEA 5, when these courses don't discuss how to make a film or video.	
	Beth understood the reason for the second discipline is to allow a teacher not previously qualified to teach these courses.	
	Gamble agrees that someone who only meets BRCT requirements may not be best to teach for ETNC or THEA. While have teachers that don't meet the usual qualifications, these particular teachers are a good fit, so the second discipline is a good way to handle this problem.	
	Michael noted we rely on discipline experts to decide if these teachers are appropriate, and make a note in the course. However, the CAC still has a responsibility to approve this. We may want to have these faculty members come in and discuss this.	
	If we add a second discipline, it will exist in perpetuity regardless of who the teacher is. Gamble will contact the appropriate people to come and discuss this issue with the committee.	
	Fred wanted to clarify why we would have people come into to discuss. Is it to find out if the current person is good fit for teaching a class, or to find out why BRCT should be added as second discipline. The group agreed that we are having people come to discuss the whether BRCT should be added as a second discipline.	
	LaRon wants to know the process of when to have faculty come in and address the committee. Michael has asked that something is entered into Curricunet that says this is a faculty driven recommendation, and then the CAC votes.	
	He Seon asks is there a requirement for the faculty to include a rational?	

Fred aked if this is something the CAC should be approving? Is it common for faculty to present at CAC? Gamble offers the faculty
the option to come, but this is an unusual situation.
Fred noted we should reach out to Heather Craig and invite her to come for the discussion.
There was discussion of next semester and when we can meet again. Gamble would like to meet before the semester starts. There is a March 1 st deadline for Fall 2017 courses and we have a lot of courses in the pipeline.
Kim asked if there are many new courses? Course revisions that are non-substantial would likely be able to meet the deadline.
Michael mentioned that there is a new process that the Chancellor's office is using. Last Fall we could sign a letter saying a course was a non-substantial change and they would approve. Now they will also include substantial changes, new courses, etc We sign a letter saying that we follow Title 5 and all other regulations and then the Chancellor's office will approve it, so it will be a faster approval. Only new Programs will take time to approve.
We need to provide training on stand-alone courses and PCAH.
Gamble thinks we need to meet regardless in January. Jan 4 or 11 are the first 2 Wednesdays in the year. Gamble will send an email later on when we will meet.
