- Reauthorization of Perkins Grant
  - Email to CTE faculty sent last week
  - The US House of Representatives approved it, and it's now in the Senate. It's still not finalized, and may not be until after the election; however, it was strongly supported in the House
- CTE Dean position
  - o Discussion of submitted feedback by Jon Mikkelsen, DJ, Monika, and Scott
  - If you have more feedback, please email Sara Metz (<u>smetz@mpc.edu</u>)
  - Specifically, Michael would like to know what kind of support is needed for CTE faculty
- Strong Workforce updates
  - Michael attended the CTE Leadership Group meeting on 9/16
    - 28 community colleges met, including CEO's, vice presidents, deans, faculty
    - The purpose of the funding is to have more and better CTE
    - Improve CTE outcomes (ex. Students with a living wage, job placement, wage advancement, equity, etc.)
    - Another emphasis of the funding is career pathways for unemployed and underemployed (training for people in the industry)
    - 60% of funding will be allocated to the College, 40% for the region
      - Center of Excellence can provide data about labor market information, IT, studies, tools, etc.
      - There was considerable discussion at the meeting about how the 40% will be distributed
        - Should it go to the region, to Colleges for local/regional needs?

- The Regional Consortium will continue to work with colleges about this
- Will fund netlab, and for marketing
- \$500 million marketing campaign, on social media
- This funding is meant to combine/braid multiple types of funding
- 10/21 & 12/2, the State will hold meetings with stakeholders to get feedback from workforce boards, industry, the CSU's, adult schools, etc.
- Plans due January 31, 2017; Colleges will have until Dec. 2018 to spend money
  - A committee will review the plans and metrics of student outcomes; this will be an annual application going forward
- There will be another Leadership Group meeting in January 2017
- What can we spend this money on? It's very open; faculty, equipment, things that will increase FTES
  - There is accountability; funding will be reduced if we don't meet certain goals/metrics
  - Important for MPC to do better collecting metrics data
  - Can use money to fund collection of data
- MPC needs to integrate our planning processes
- Professional Development Opportunities

    - Opportunities like these are important since you can meet with CTE colleagues
  - <u>CCCAOE Conference</u> September 27-29
    - Too late for Fall, plan for Spring (March 2017)
    - It's a great opportunity to take part in useful workshops
  - <u>WomenTech Educators Online Training</u>- begins October 3
    - This organization hosts many different events/training, focusing on nontraditional populations; Michael receives their emails and will share those events he finds relevant to faculty

- CTE faculty involvement is important
- These groups create and determine a model/uniform curriculum, so faculty should be involved to have a voice and influence what is included
- Career and Technology Education Management Application
  - For colleges that do not currently use CATEMA: Licensed access and technical support for a period of three years
  - An initial online site tour and training session for your designated system administrator
  - A day of onsite training for your staff and your secondary partners
  - Extended reporting capabilities including merge letters, detailed and summary reports on student participation and course outcomes and support for customized reports.
  - Data export services for local data needs and the LaunchBoard
  - MPC can use this to track students from high school to college
  - Career pathway data is built into this
  - Meeting attendees discussed possibility of having dedicated person for CATEMA
