

- 2. Develop five-district draft trustee area scenarios that have equal populations (within the permitted deviation) and conform to the requirements of the federal Voting Rights Act.
- 3. Meet with community advisory committee and refine scenario(s) until one is selected.
- 4. Prepare preclearance submission
- 5. Provide detailed documentation for adopted plan to District, County Office of Education, Registrar of Voters.


Northern MPC 2010 Census block populations by ethnicity (proportional symbols)

Redistricting Tasks: Next Steps

- 2. Develop five-district draft trustee area scenarios that have equal populations (within the permitted deviation) and conform to the requirements of the federal Voting Rights Act. *Next step – possible "minimum change" approaches already identified.*
- 3. Meet with community advisory committee and refine scenario(s) until one is selected.
 - Board appoints advisory committee (2 per district) in June
 - Committee meets July-August, makes recommendations to Board in August; Board adopts plan in September
- 4. Prepare preclearance submission
- 5. Provide detailed documentation for adopted plan to District, Registrars of Voters.
