# **Academic Affairs Report**

### 1. Personnel Changes in Academic Affairs:

As we come to the end of the academic year, we say a fond farewell to long time Dean of Instructional Planning, **Michael Gilmartin**. Thank you, Michael, for your years of dedication to our office and our college!

We welcome two new deans to our office:

**Dr. Cathryn Wilkinson**, Dean of Instruction for Liberal Arts, will be responsible for the Humanities Division, Social Science Division, Creative Arts Division, and Continuing Education.

**Ms. Judith Cutting**, Dean of Instruction for Career and Technical Education (CTE), will be responsible for the Business Division, CTE programs, CTE grants, and economic/workforce development.

While we are in recruitment for the Dean of Instruction for STEM, **Dr. Paul Long** will serve in this capacity and be responsible for the Physical Science Division, Life Science Division, Physical Education Division, Nursing and the MATE Center.

**Dr. Jon Knolle** will serve as Dean of Instruction of Library, Learning Resources and Online Education. In addition to being responsible for the Library Division and for Online Education, he will be responsible for the operational aspects of curriculum, catalog, scheduling, and enrollment management in the Office of Academic Affairs.

#### 2. Update on Marina Education Center:

We are continuing the process of growing enrollments in the Fort Ord Center, which includes the Marina Education Center, the Public Safety Training Center and classes in the high schools in Marina and Seaside. Academic Affairs, Student Services and Administrative Services are collaborating closely on their respective aspects to develop the Fort Ord Center.

The Medical Assisting program will be one of the anchor programs at the Marina Education Center. One of the portables is being renovated this summer to become the Allied Health facility.

Additional classes have been scheduled in the Marina Education Center in fall. Two portables are being renovated this summer for lecture-style classes.

Administration of Justice classes are being offered in the Public Safety Training Center along with classes in other public safety programs such as Fire Technology, Emergency Management Services (EMS), Paramedics, Fire Academy and the Police Academy.

#### 3. Curriculum Institute:

A team of 5 will be attending the annual Curriculum Institute hosted by the Academic Senate of California Community Colleges in July to learn about the newly adopted changes in streamlining curricular processes in the State Chancellor's Office. They are Dr. Jon Knolle (CIO designee), Dr. Gamble Madsen (Chair of the Curriculum Advisory Committee), Kim Kingswold (Academic Curriculum and Catalog Technician), He Seon Inh (Articulation Specialist), and Dr. Alfred Hochstaedter (Member of the Curriculum Advisory Committee).
