Criteria for mission statements according to Accreditation Standard IA:

- 1. The institution's mission describes its <u>broad educational purposes</u>, its <u>degrees and credentials</u> <u>offered</u>, its <u>intended student population</u>, and its <u>commitment to student success</u>, as <u>reflected in student learning and student achievement</u>. The institution's programs and services are aligned with its mission.
- 2. The institution <u>uses data</u> to determine how effectively it is accomplishing its mission, and whether the mission directs institutional priorities and educational needs of students.
- 3. The mission guides institutional decision-making, planning, and resource allocation and informs institutional goals for student learning and achievement.
- 4. The institutional mission statement is approved by the governing board and published.

So our mission needs to:

- 1. Refer to educational purposes
- 2. Reference degrees offered
- 3. Refer to intended student population ("Institutions are expected to identify the intended student population for DE/CE programs.") Could use something like, "...and all who can benefit from our programs."
- 4. Reference commitment to student success and/or student learning and achievement
- 5. Be measurable, as we need to "use data to determine how effectively" we are "accomplishing the mission."
- 6. Direct institutional priorities and educational needs of students.
