What does the 2017 Scorecard measure?

- College Profile

 - Basic Skills
 - Career Technical Education
 - Overall Degree & Certificate Completion or Transfer Attainment
- Progress for first-time college students



Usefulness & Context

What are the limitations of the 2017 Scorecard?

- Based on cohort analysis
 - Includes only a subset of students
 - Cohort may not accurately or completely capture population
 - May be difficult to interpret changes over time
- In-depth analysis requires support from institutional research
- Peer college comparisons are challenging

This report expands upon the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office Student Success Scorecard using that same data. The Student Success Scorecard tracks college performance and achievement gaps in remedial instruction, job training programs, retention of students and graduation and completion rates.

This report shows outcomes for students who are flagged as "Prepared for College Level"^{**} and "Unprepared for College Level"^{***} with slicers for student disability, economic status, gender, ethnicity and age group.

In referencing completion data, the report also refers to students who achieve the status "Transfer Prepared"^{****}.

Clicking on sections of the visualizations filters the totals counts in the bottom right corner of each page.

^{**}Lowest attempted English or Math course was "Unprepared for College Level"

^{***}Student successfully completed 60 UC/CSU transferable units with a GPA \geq 2.0
