Athletic

- The men's golf team is ranked #1 in Northern California. They lead their division of the Big 8 Conference. They are building to the Northern California Championships and a bid in the state tournament.

Education Center at Marina

- The Education Center at Marina experienced a power outage on March 13, and evening classes were cancelled. When power was restored, there was smoke and a burning smell in the Mechanical Room. One of the four motors for the boiler system failed, and upon inspection, Facilities discovered that the remaining three had sustained damage. All four required replacement. Facilities worked quickly to secure and install the motors (through our vendor), and heat was restored on March 21. The software for the Paging Gateway was also damaged during the outage which prohibited the wall clocks from communicating with the Monterey Campus. IT worked to resolve this issue, and the clocks were up and running on April 12.
- The Education Center at Marina has hosted the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program which began February 5 and wrapped up on April 16. Judy Cutting arranged for their presence; the VITA program offers free tax help to people who generally make \$54,000 or less, persons with disabilities, and the elderly and limited English speaking taxpayers who need assistance in preparing their own tax returns.
