Catherine Webb, ALO 23 March 2016 In its 2015 Annual Report, Monterey Peninsula College reported ongoing assessment in **only 51% of its courses** (and in 71% of programs).

Refining our definition of "active"

MPC's definition:

Active Courses = courses taught regularly

- Specifically: courses taught between Fall 2013 and Spring 2015
- Rationale: a course that isn't taught cannot be assessed
- 770 courses met this definition

Refining our definition of "active"

ACCJC/USDE's definition:

Active Courses = all courses in the Catalog

- Specifically: credit and noncredit courses
- Rationale: Catalogs include current, Stateapproved curricula that are reviewed regularly and revised as needed
- 1573 courses met this definition

Refining our definition of "program"

MPC's 2015 definition:

Programs = program areas

- Specifically: # of program areas that offer a state-approved degree or certificate
- Excluded local "fast-track" certificates of training
- 79 program areas met this definition

Refining our definition of "program"

ACCJC/USDE's definition:

Program = any Program of Study leading to a degree or certificate

- Can include locally-approved certificates or other programs as defined by the College
- 145 degrees/certificates listed in the 2015-2016 catalog

40% or above without ongoing assessment

- Programs where 40% or more of the included courses do NOT have ongoing assessment
- In other words: 60% of a program's courses have not been assessed

40% or above without ongoing assessment

Increased Course Reflections

 Strategic course reflections → assess courses that appear in multiple programs first

Improved Program Reflections

• Emphasis on discussion of shared or similar program learning outcomes (including GEOs)

- Recommending a cycle of assessment for courses that aligns with "program of study"
- Leading campus-wide discussions around "program of study assessment"
