1. <u>Welcome</u>. Introduction.

2. <u>Approval of agenda</u> - Motion by S Roth, second motion by D Gearhart. The motion carries unanimously. Approval of minutes: N/A.

**4.** <u>Standing reports</u>- California Fire Technology Directors Association (CFTDA) works with State Fire Marshal's Office (SFMO), and community colleges in supporting meeting requirements for curriculum. D Brown discussed submitting fire academy instructors for historical recognition. M Mondragon referenced the need for Firefighter I certification examination. D Gearhart requested the following standing reports: Firefighter Academy, MPC core classes, SFMO and training facilities.

5. <u>Old business</u>: N/A.

### 6. New business:

a) <u>Fall 2019 Courses</u> - H Kelley asked if there was an exception for the 15 students rule. (MPC's rule that all classes must have a minimum of 15 students or class is canceled.) J Cutting explained there is some discretion to the rule. If the class is part of a certificate of achievement or if the class is required for another course she will accept 12-13 students. There needs to be justification for this to happen. D Brown explained the new courses MPC will be offering. Many courses had been offered in the past but retired by the SFMO. D Brown is working on getting the new classes back and in MPC's curriculum.

**b)** <u>Training Ground</u> – S Roth explained the need of a training ground. Past buildings that the police and fire academy used have been demolished. Our training facility is a draw for students and one of a reason for the fire academy accreditation. The PSTC requires not only a training location but a training tower to meet the college's and SFM requirements. The PSTC requires only a small portion (1.5 million) of funds the Bond approved back in 2002. S Roth also stated that our police and fire academies are one of few programs where students can be hired right out of the academy.

### c) Certificate of Achievement voting:

 i. Vote to approve Emergency Medical Technician I Certificate of Achievement - Motion by M Mondragon, second motion by J Lundgren. The motion carries unanimously.

- ii. Vote to approve FPTC 101 + EMT classes and the Basic EMS and Fire Training
  Certificate of Achievement Motion by T Keisling, second motion by M Goodwin. The motion carries unanimously.
- iii. Vote to approve **Company Officer Certificate of Achievement** Motion by J Smith, second motion by M Mondragon. The motion carries unanimously.
- iv. Vote to approve FPTC 105A/B class for Basic Firefighter I Academy Certificate of Achievement - Motion by S Roth, second motion by J Lundgren. The motion carries unanimously.

**7.** <u>Good of the order</u> - . M Mondragon discussed CalFire hiring employee's right out of the fire academy. D Gearhart stated as a retired fire professional he and his son could not have furthered their careers without the support of MPC's fire service training. S Roth says 1.5 million of the bond money could buy a training tower and it be placed at Joe Lloyd Way. In 6 months the PSTC could have a training tower that South Bay and the fire training use. D Brown says that local fire agencies could use the new training grounds and generate FTES though ISA's (Instructional Service Agreement). J Cutting thanked everyone for the feedback. J Cutting told meeting members to reach out to her or D Brown with any thoughts or information on the program.
