Our Marina and Seaside campuses have grown strategically and we are continuing to explore growth opportunities in collaboration and with the guidance of our Counseling Department and Student Services, in alignment with the vision of both campuses.

Programs Available for Completion at the Marina Education Center as of 10/30/13:

- Certification for Completion of CSU General Education - Transfer
- Certification for Completion of IGETC – Transfer to CSU or UC
- Certificate of Completion - English as a Second Language Intermediate Level

Early Childhood Education Development classes are also currently offered at our Marina campus which can be used toward COE permitting for work in childcare centers.

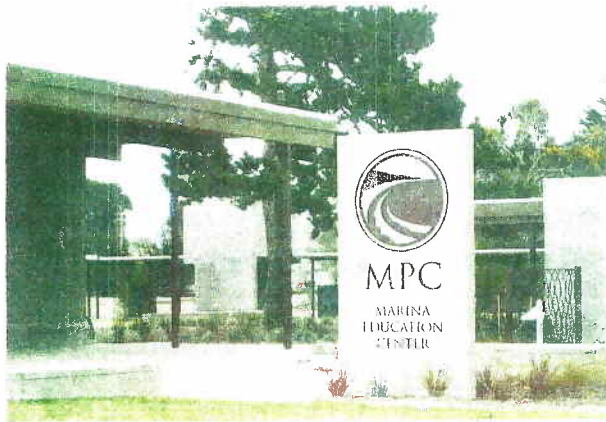
Four new Continuing Education Pathways in Health Care related areas including a Pharmacy Technology certificate, a Certified Nursing Assistant and a Nursing Assistant, and Phlebotomy technician programs, each of which have been quite successful.

Programs Available for Completion at the Public Safety Training Center:

- Fire Protection Technology Certificate of Achievement & Associate in Science Degree
- Emergency Medical Technician Certificate of Training. Once completing the course work students are eligible to take the EMT National Registry test. If successful in passing the National Registry students can apply to work on an ambulance.

We continue to work in collaboration with The South Bay Regional Public Safety consortium Police Academy to offer training at the MPC Seaside facility. Further developments are being explored for both locations to include various pathways towards Business Certificates at the Marina Campus, and a variety of Public Safety pathways, including one in Administration of Justice, at our Seaside Campus, and growing collaborative efforts with the College of Law.

Monterey Peninsula College's Education Center at Marina gives residents of northwestern Monterey County an opportunity to pursue a college education close to home or work. We offer a variety of day and evening courses including English as a Second Language, basic skills, general education and business. We are conveniently located at 289 12th Street (Imjin Parkway and 3rd Street) in Marina. Our 12,000 square-foot permanent facility, with eight classrooms, opened in the fall of 2011. To support students enrolled in classes at this campus, a variety of services are provided on site on a rotational basis including counseling, financial aid, veterans' services, English and Study

Skills, Math Learning Center, library services and general tutoring. Office hours are 8:00 a.m. to 9:15 p.m. Monday through Thursday, and 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on Friday.

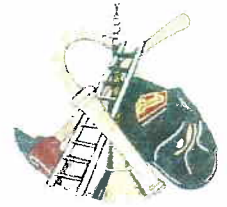

FIRE PROTECTION TECHNOLOGY:

Fire Protection Technology program currently has a single pathway for a degree. The courses are set-up on rotating semester basis to achieve certification. The core requirements consist of five courses for a total of fifteen units. There are an additional nine units required from a list of twelve classes.

We are currently revising the program, to include the following:

Pathway:

Establish a pathway from high school (working with Alison Shelling) into Monterey Peninsula College, and then have an articulation agreement with CSU Monterey Bay. (working with Elizabeth Harrington).

Multiple focuses:

Instead of a single focus, I recommend having five. The multiple focuses would include: Basic Fire Academy, General Studies, Fire Management, Fire Prevention, and Fire Command.

Fire Academy program: students are required to complete an Emergency Medical Technician course prior to being admitted into the Fire Academy. MPC's EMT classes are currently offered twice a semester at the PSTC; we are working on adding a 3rd class, possibly on Saturdays, to enhance this pathway.

The next enhancement we are developing is the focus. Students would be able to use part of the 21 units acquired from completing the Fire Academy towards their Fire Protection Technology degree. (In the current program students can only use their units as electives) This change to multiple focuses will provide students with several different paths to achieve their goals.

Course Numbers:

We are currently working towards the renumbering of classes to incorporate both the FACD and FIRE classes into the new course identification FPTC. Six of the current courses will be CSU transferable (my goal).

EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN (EMT):

The EMT course provides the student with a Certificate of Training. Once completing the course work students are eligible to take the EMT National Registry test. If successful in passing the National Registry students can apply to work on an ambulance.

ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE (ADMJ):

MPC will offer one section of Introduction to ADMJ at the PSTC in Spring 2014.

Depending on students' interest our plan is to continue to offer and potentially expand ADMJ offerings at the PSTC in 2014-15. Connections to South Bay Police Academy and Monterey College of Law programs are being explored.

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Potential Programs with Additional Classes Added

- Certificate of Completion – English as a Second Language Advanced Level
(add Level 4 and Level 5 classes)
- Certificate of Training - Business Office Technology Fast Track: Entry Level Office Worker
(add CSIS 70 or BUSC 122; BUSC 121 or BUSI 100; English 300)
This could be expanded to another Certificate of Training – Level 2. With more expansion students could earn a Certificate of Achievement and/or an A.S. degree.
- There are also ECED classes currently offered which can be used toward COE permits for work in childcare centers.

Through MPC's Continuing Education program (not for credit), the following programs can be completed at the Education Center in Marina:

- Pharmacy Technician (currently offered twice/year; classroom training followed by externship)
- Certified Nurse Assistant (currently offered for first time; will probably offer 3-4 times/year; classroom training followed by clinical on-site training)
- Home Health Aide (first offering Jan. 2014; can be added onto CNA training; will probably offer 3-4 times/year; classroom training followed by clinical on-site training)
- Phlebotomy Technician (first offering Jan. 2014; will probably offer twice/year; classroom training followed by externship)
