WHAT IS UPWARD BOUND?

Upward Bound is one of many TRIO programs. TRIO programs are **funded by the federal government** and exist all across the United States.

The purpose of TRIO programs is to **increase** the number of historically disadvantaged students attending and **graduating** from college.

So, **Upward Bound** is a program to help a select number of high school students prepare for, attend, and graduate from college!

HOW MUCH DOES UPWARD BOUND COST?

The federal government funds the Upward Bound program.

There is NO COST to students and families.

All services are **FREE** to students who are selected to join.

HOW LONG IS UPWARD BOUND?

Four Year Commitment = Four Year Opportunity!

Students who are selected to join Upward Bound remain in the program all four years of high school.

Summer Academy + Academic Year

Upward Bound has services and activities both during the summer **and** the academic year.



SUMMER TRIP

The summer trip is a 3-day trip to Southern California.

TUTORIAL IN THE TLC!

(TRIO LEARNING CENTER)

UB students have access to

FREE after school tutoring at

MPC four days a week:

TUTORIAL



Important:

All UB students must attend tutorial at least

2 hours per week, minimum! Students can choose to come any day/time that works best for them during our open hours.

Tutors are available to help with core academic subjects!

Students can receive help with:

- Study skills & preparing for tests
- Homework & assignments
- And have access to computers, printer, textbooks, resources

SATURDAY WORKSHOPS

Typically I-2 Saturdays a month at MPC, for 3 Hours: 9AM - I2PM

Saturday Workshops are a time for all UB students to come together to learn about colleges & careers, as well as participate in personal development activities.

In this picture, students learned how to make dental impressions in the Dental Assisting lab at MPC during a Saturday Workshop.



You will have Upward Bound counselors to meet with and talk to about your academic and personal well being.

You will meet with a counselor at least once every semester to make sure you are on track to reach your goals.

Your UB counselors can also provide support and referrals for issues that need even more attention.

COMMUNITY SERVICE & VOLUNTEERING


Because everything in the program is **free**, we believe **it is important for our students to give back** to the community.

TEST & COLLEGE APPLICATION FEE WAIVERS

Did you know that it costs MONEY to apply for college?

Each university you apply to can cost \$50-\$100 per application.


Upward Bound students are eligible for fee waivers that will cover the cost of at least 4 college applications, in addition to access to SAT & ACT fee waivers. The SAT & ACT are standardized tests required for college admission that students must typically pay to take.

STIPENDS

UB students earn a small stipend (money) based on their participation.

Stipends are given out three times during the year:

- end of summer (July)
- end of fall (December)
- end of spring (June)





IMPORTANT INFO:

GUIDELINES FOR ELIGIBILITY



- → Only current 8th grade students may apply
- → Must attend an MPUSD high school (Marina, Monterey, or Seaside High)
- → Student must be a U.S. Citizen or Permanent Resident

 (Status of parents/family members does not matter, this only applies to the student)
- → Potential First-Generation College Student
 - This means that neither parent has earned a bachelor's degree from a university in the United States)
- → And/Or: Income Eligible
 - This means that your family's income meets federal low-income guidelines. We will help you determine this based on the information you include in your application.

PARTICIPATION COMMITMENT

THIS IS A BIG DEAL!

You are applying to a 4-year program that will provide you with **amazing opportunities** to reach your goal of going to college.

But, you must be willing to commit the time to put in the work and participate in the program.

- 4 Year Program
- 2 Hours/Week Minimum at MPC for Tutorial After School
- Saturday Workshops (I-2/Month)
- Summer Academy

Mandatory Summer Participation & Attendance

All newly admitted students must participate in the Summer Academy.

Students who will be absent for **five or more days** during the summer will **NOT** be accepted into the program.

Summer 2020 Planned Dates: June 11 - July 18*

*Dates may change

Transportation

Transportation to/from Monterey Peninsula College for program services such as the Summer Academy, tutoring, counseling meetings, Saturday Workshops, etc. is **not provided**.

Students must arrange their own transportation to/from MPC (many of our students ride the bus).

HOW DOI BECOME AN UPWARD BOUND STUDENT?

Because we are only allowed to serve 100 students, students must go through an application & interview process and be selected to join.

RECRUITMENT PROCESS

- 1. Attend Student Presentation at Middle School
 - Complete <u>Student Interest Form</u> Online
- 2. Review Program Overview Video with Parent/Guardian
- 3. Submit Completed Application Online by the Deadline
- 4. Interview (we will schedule this with you via email)
- **5.** Receive Decision Letter
- 6. Mandatory New Student Orientation

How Many Students Does UB Accept?

Upward Bound serves approximately 100 students total:

- 9th Graders: 25 Students
- 10th Graders: 25 Students
- 11th Graders: 25 Student
- 12th Graders: 25 Students

So, each year, 25 seniors graduate and we accept 25 new incoming freshmen (that's you!)
