1.	Welcome -David welcomed all.	
2.	Campus community comments - no campus community comments were shared.	
3.	Approval of May 19, 2020 Agenda	Approval / Consensus
4.	MPC Draft Reopening Plan -David introduced the draft Plan (subject to change based on State and County health orders) and reviewed the different stages for General Institution; currently the campus is in Stage 0 - Shelter In Place. He emphasized the need for the campus to be flexible. For Fall 2020, three instruction scenarios were reviewed. David provided an in depth review of each Stage: Stage 1 - Initial Return-Significant Limitations; open to employees, not students except for very essential needs, not open to the public. Stage 2 - Partial Return with Limitations; open to employees for limited student services and instructional support- no public or non-college events. Stage 3 - Full Return with Limitations; open to employees and all students, not public or non-college events. Stage 4 - Full Return without Limitations; open to employees, students and public events. Online instructional and non-instructional will be offered to meet the demand. This stage is largely believed to coincide with a time with the availability of a COVID vaccine. David invited comments/feedback. Member comments included the following: The Draft Plan illustrates much thoughtful consideration given to the many groups affected, including those with childcare needs. Scenario 1 - for Fall Instruction, this face-to-face and online (with contingencies) is not likely by Fall; this scenario is provided for context and the campus is essentially in a modified stage one currently over the past few weeks. MPC will utilize guidance provided by the County and State; once the Governor enacts plans to reopen schools (Stage 5), the District will reassess. The Draft Plan is the District's internal plan. Hybrid instruction provides a degree of flexibility in the case of illnesses, a return to shelter in place or to create more instructional space. The Infectious Disease Outbreak Plan (IDOP) contains additional protocol with regard to reactions in the wake of an illness. Funding for future safety improvements were discussed. Face to face i	

	 The District must explore all options towards transitioning back to more face-to-face instructions following State and local guidelines. Initially, the <u>Shelter in Place order</u> for Monterey County was in place with an ending date that continues to be updated. Assessment of work spaces, faculty office spaces and other spaces will be a key component of the reopening plan. Next steps include sharing this Draft document with other groups on campus (AAAG, Academic Senate, Public Forums on Thu., 12noon & 5p.m. and Friday at 8 a.m. The document provides the framework to address future unseen circumstances and invite input as circumstances unfold.
