CAC review and approval of Distance Education course revisions effective Fall 2020; process

MPC decided to have a fully online summer 2020 session. Faculty have been encouraged to move as many courses online for fall 2020. College is evolving and new decisions are being made daily, so decisions for fall could be revised. The state gave a blanket approval for all spring 2020 courses to be taught online. They did not give the same blanket approval for summer and fall courses. Instead they are giving the colleges until the end of the year to complete the local approval process. This will significantly increase the number of revisions coming to the committee. Some courses were recently revised and may not need much review other than

the DE areas. However, there are a great number of courses that have not been reviewed for a number of years. Their reviews will likely be more comprehensive. All of this leads to the larger than normal load for fall. Jon Knolle has created an MPC DE Revision Proposal Quick Reference guide to assist with needed training as well as other resources available on the intranet. There is a \$300 stipend for faculty members who complete these revisions. There can only be one revision per course and the process will be organized by the department and/or division chair. Although it is not yet confirmed, Jon is also working to secure some type of compensation for CAC members. This will likely be 2-3 TLUs for the fall semester. Committee work does not usually constitute any additional compensation for their members as it is a part of their contract. This is a unique situation and a very large workload (46 courses for summer and 372 for fall). Some divisions have already started this process. This will likely require CAC to meet weekly in the fall and possibly over the summer. Gamble will follow up with information for the possible summer meeting.
