Chapter 4 Academic Affairs**4236****AP 4236 Advanced Placement Credit**

NOTE: This procedure is legally required.

Advanced Placement (AP) Examinations

Any student who passes a College Board Advanced Placement (AP) examination with a minimum score of three in a subject matter will be awarded credit in a general education area with a subject matter similar to that of the AP examination.

Students may earn credit for College Entrance Examination Board Advanced Placement (AP) exams with scores listed in the College Catalog. AP can be used to meet IGETC, CSU GE, and AA/AS general education requirements as indicated in the College Catalog. For credit to be applied, students must have the College Board send their official AP exam results to the Monterey Peninsula College Admissions and Records Office. Only official, sealed copies will be accepted. All units denote semester.

College-Level Examination Program (CLEP) Examinations

Students may earn credit for College-Level Examination program (CLEP) exams with scores of 50 or higher. CLEP credit can be used to meet CSU GE and AA/AS general education and/or major requirements. For credit to be applied, students must have the College Board send their official CLEP exam results to the Monterey Peninsula College Admissions and Records Office. Only official, sealed copies will be accepted. CLEP does not apply to IGETC and is not accepted at UC.

International Baccalaureate (IB) Examinations

Monterey Peninsula College considers for transfer credit high-level International Baccalaureate examinations where a grade of 5, 6, or 7 has been earned. The official International Baccalaureate transcript must be submitted to the Admissions and Records Office for review once the student has enrolled. The examinations may also be used to meet prerequisites for other courses.

For any AP examination that the District does not offer a course similar in content, the District will award credit in the General Education area shown on the California Community College General Education AP List. If there is no General Education area that fits the AP Examination, the District may award elective credit.

The District shall post its Advanced Placement Credit procedure on its Internet Web site.
