In fall 2019 and spring 2020, Monterey Peninsula College considered the Institution-set Standards and has now set both floor and aspirational goals for each of the identified metrics. Importantly, the standards are included as measures of progress in college's 2020-2025 Educational Master Plan.

To maximize the ease of use of the standards in tandem with other student success efforts at the college, MPC faculty and administration considered the notion of identifying the State of California's Vision for Success metrics for improvement under both the institution-set standards analysis and the state's accountability system. The College shared this idea with ACCJC staff who ratified the college's decision.

In light of the differences in how the measures are operationalized under the two systems, the college will pivot to use of the Vision for Success metrics. To ensure continuity with historical data, the data reported in this Annual Report are based on the methodology that is aligned with the Vision for Success. The Institution-set Standards can be found at the website noted in this report.

The college's methodology for the Institution-set Standards is the 5-year mean (using the most recent 5 years of data) minus the average standard deviation for the most recent 5 years. We use the same methodology for all of the student achievement metrics.

Regarding stretch goals, our college originally established short-term (1 yr.) and long-term (7yr.) stretch goals for course completion rates through the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office Institutional Effectiveness Partnership Initiative (IEPI) framework of indicators process. This year, the college reexamined and reset the stretch goals for course completion rates. These new stretch goals have been set for the current 2019-20 year through the 2022-23 year. Similarly, our college developed a methodology for setting stretch goals for other student achievement metrics: certificates, degrees, and transfer. The stretch goals for these other student achievement metrics cover the same years as the stretch goals set for course completion rates. To ensure alignment across our work, the stretch goals for certificates, degrees, and transfers are based on the same methodology that the college adopted when it set stretch goals for the Chancellor's Office Vision for Success initiative. The methodology for both the Institution-set Standards and the stretch goals are posted on the same page on our college website where we display our student achievement data.

The data for job placement rates is from Perkins Core Indicator reports, available through the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office. Our college establishes Institution-set standards only for those programs for which there were 10 or more completers for five (5) years in a row.

The data included in this report are certified as a complete and accurate representation of the reporting institution.

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
