

What is Dual Enrollment?

Programs that allow students to take **K-12** and college courses at the same time. The term dual enrollment refers to the **student** being enrolled in two distinct academic programs or educational institutions. In the community college system these students are special admit students in which MPC receive 1.8FTS.






Unduplicated Head Count for Dual Enrollment (Includes Fall, Spring, summer)

For students within the CCAP pathway, only one application during high school is required. Students will need to know both their MPC student ID and their CCCID in order for complete the process. Once Form A is approved, it will be reflected on the student's WebReg portal, under the Petitions' link.





- Lack of full time staff dedicated to Dual Enrollment at MPC
- Budget for the program
- Available Faculty to teach courses:
 - Lack of HS teachers that meet minimum qualifications
 - Lack of MPC faculty that can make HS schedule work
- High School Bell schedules do not match traditional college schedule
- Cumbersome enrollment steps for Students
