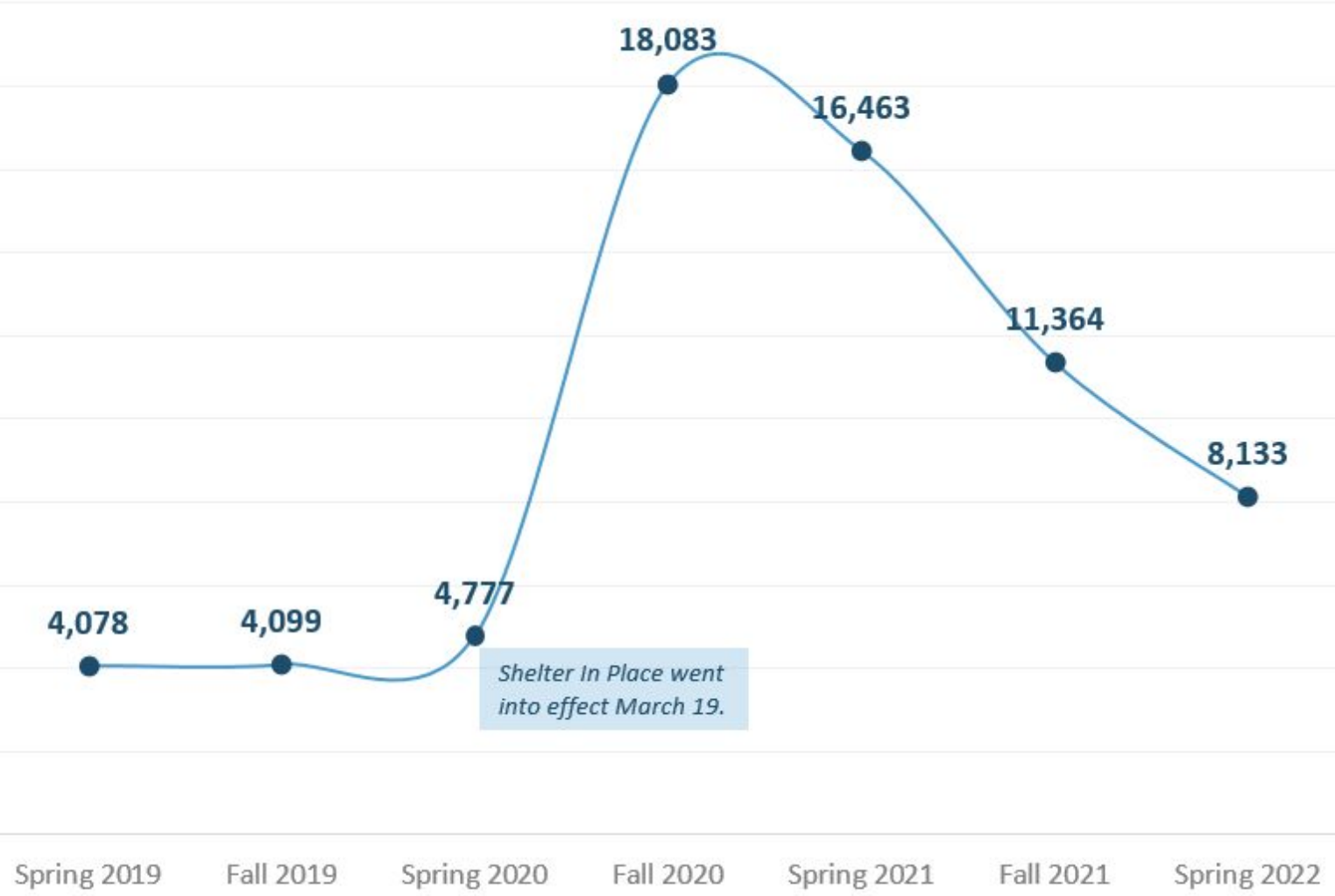


Program Health: Enrollment Data Key Terms

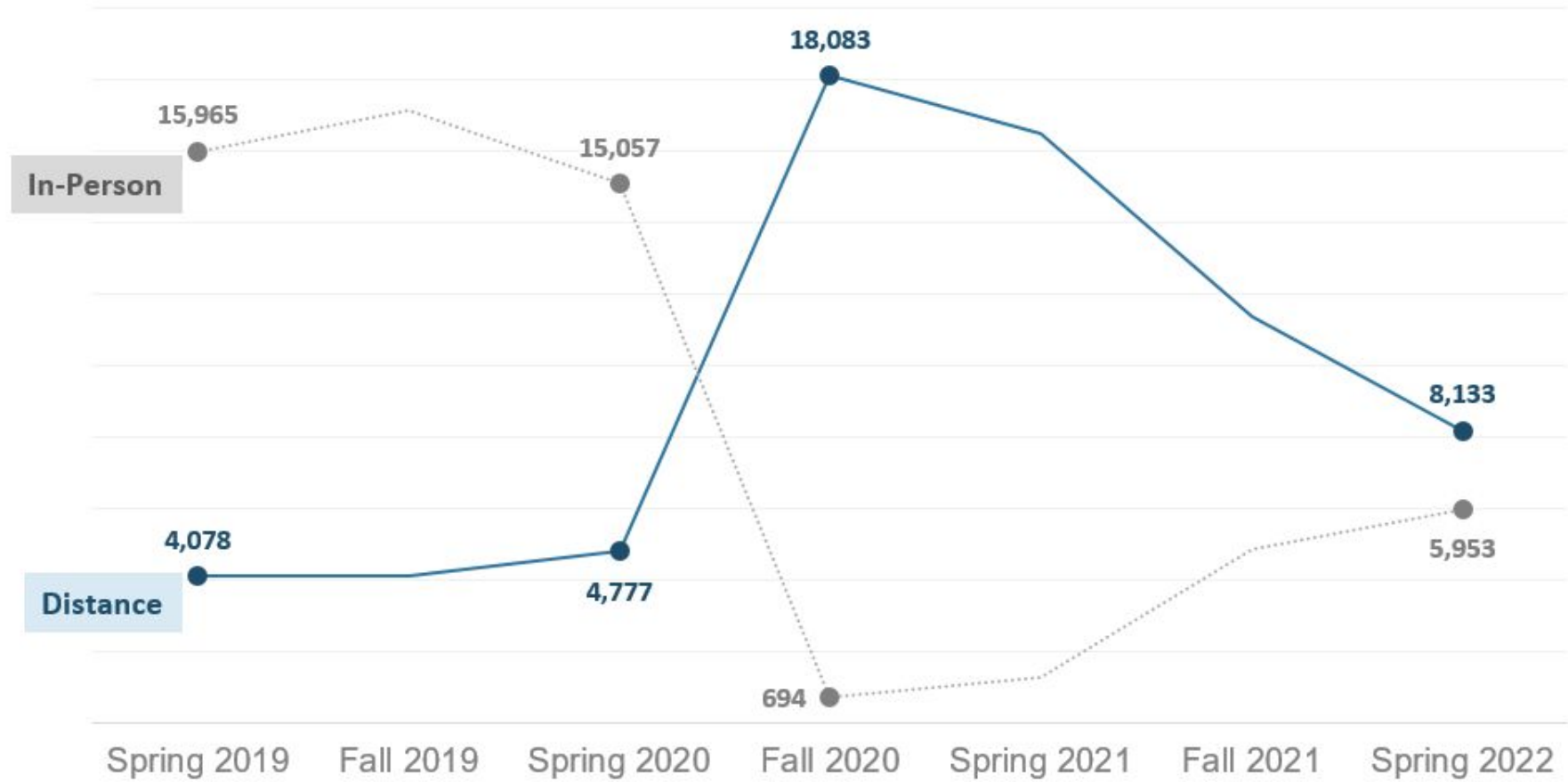
- Distance Education (DE): means instruction in which the instructor and student are separated by distance and interact through the assistance of communication technology.
- Enrollment Count: The count of students enrolled in a section of a course. It is not to be confused with student count since students can be enrolled in more than one section. Students can also enroll multiple times in the same course.
- Retention: Of all credit enrollments, the rate at which students completed courses and did not drop or withdraw from them.
- Success: Of all credit enrollments, the rate at which completed courses with a grade of A, B, C or P.



After the implementation of Shelter In Place, there was an increase in Distance Education enrollment.



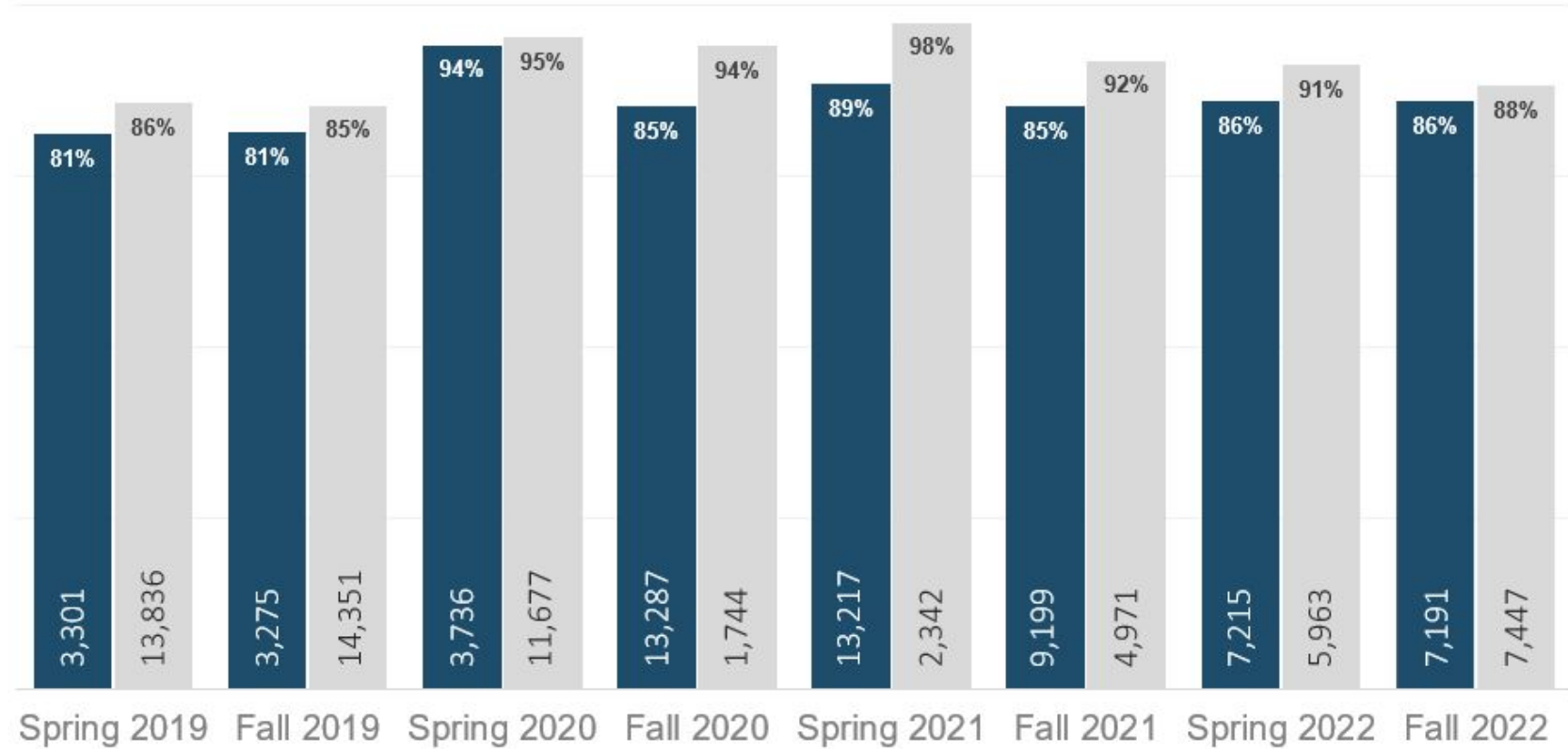
Enrollment in Distance Education courses exceeded that of In-Person courses in Fall 2020.

■ In-Person

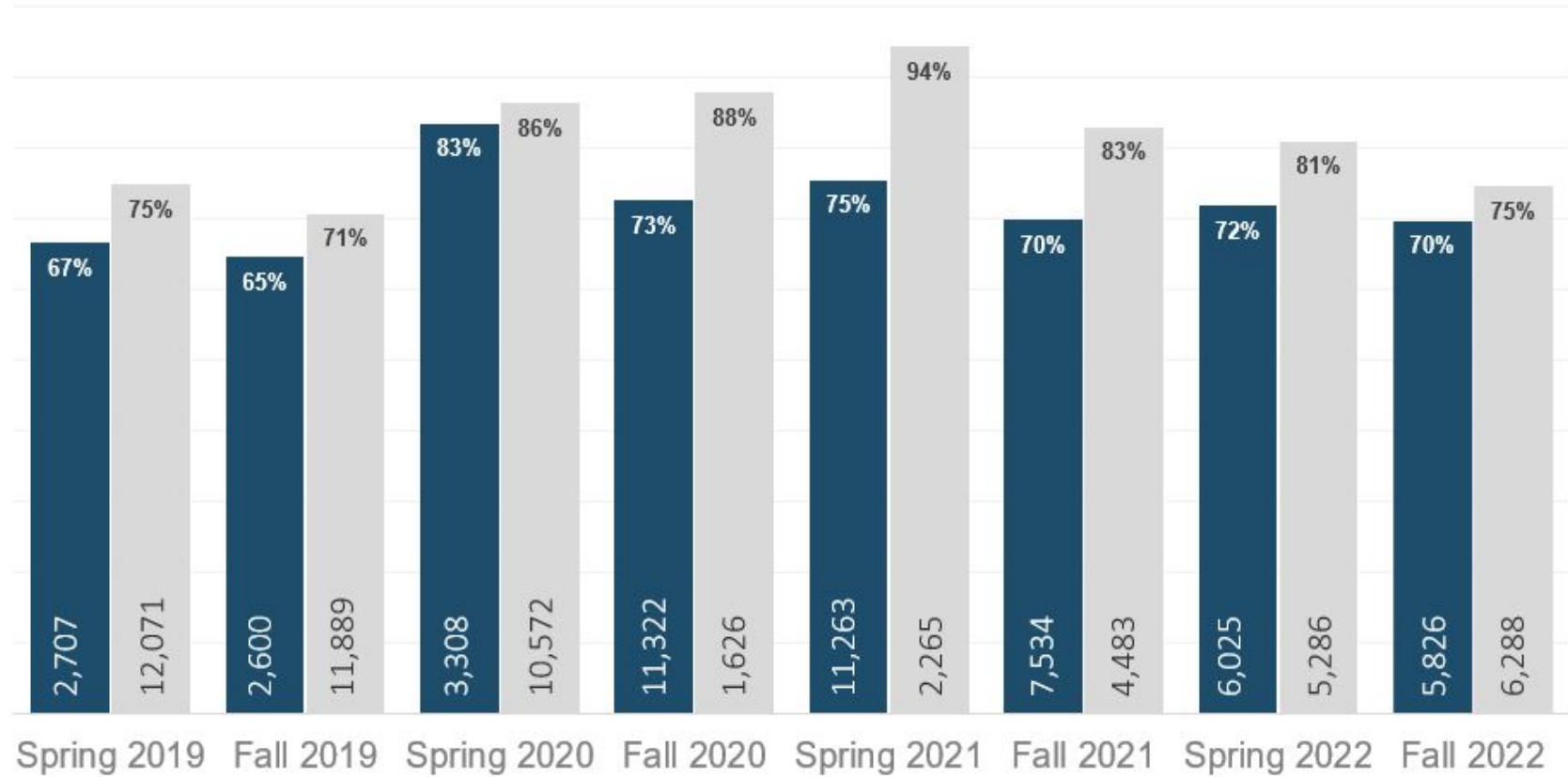
Course Retention Rates in Credit Courses

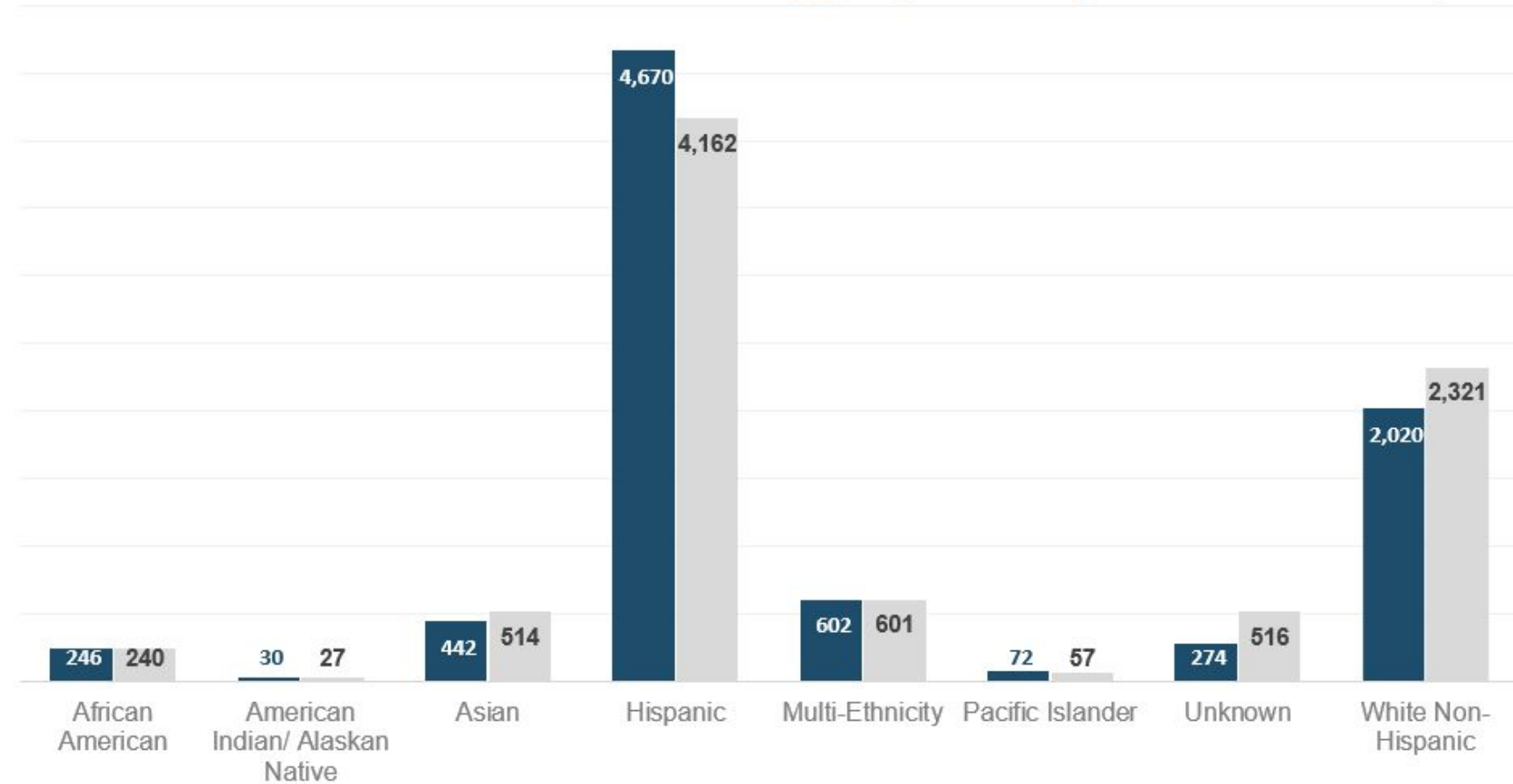

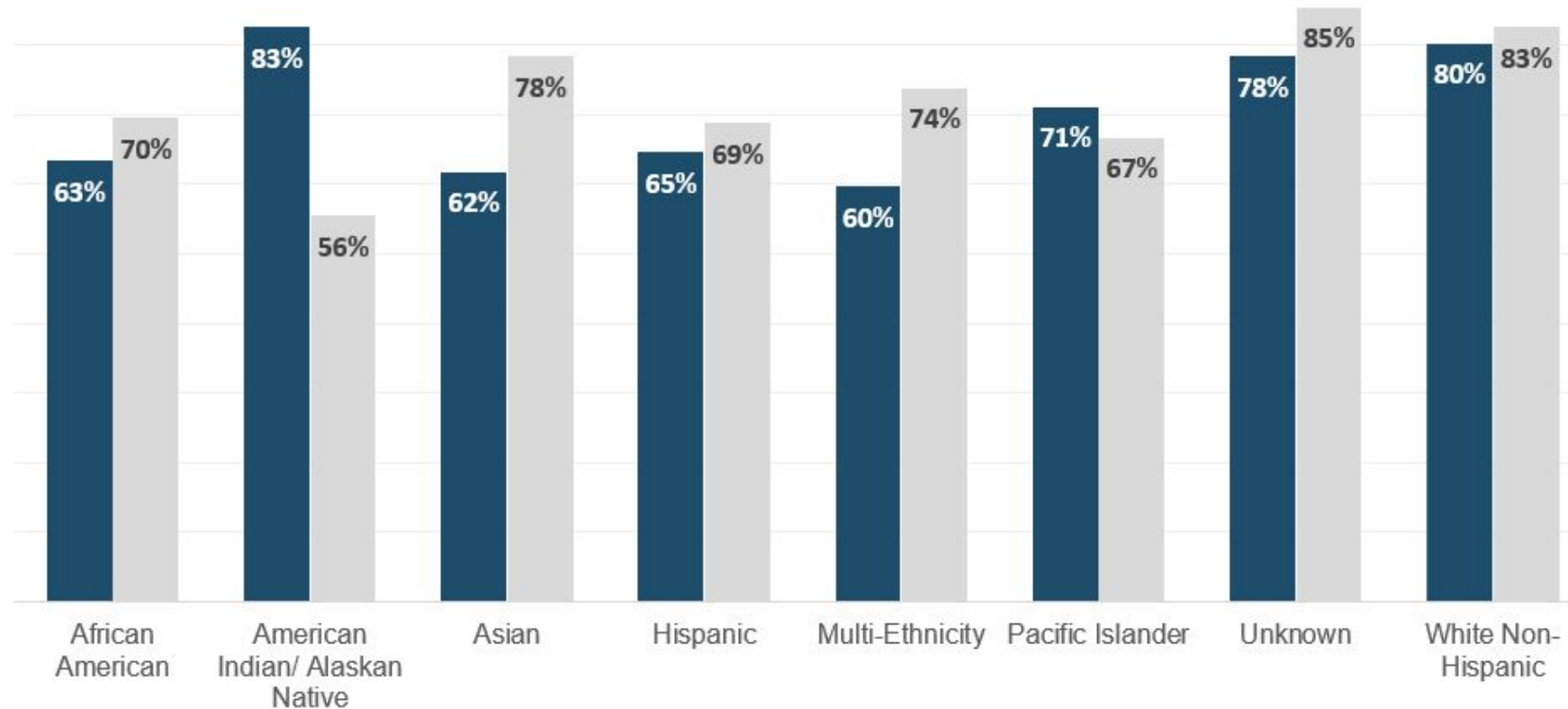
Enrollment in Distance Education and In-Person Credit Courses in Fall 2022, Disaggregated by Race/Ethnicity

Program Health: Data Takeaways

- Distance Education Enrollment
 - Surged 300+ percent during COVID-19.
 - Distance Education enrollment was close to 100% higher in Spring 2022 than Spring 2019 (the last pre-COVID semester).
 - Overall DE enrollments are higher now (post-COVID) than they were (pre-COVID).
- What can we improve?
 - Increase the success and retention rates of DE enrollments



External Influences: COVID-19 Campus Shutdown

- Major Impact
 - Rapid shift to fully online support
 - 2020 saw a 157% increase in ticket volume compared to 2019.
 - 2020 had 55% higher ticket volume than 2016. In 2016 MPC adopted Canvas and was the most challenging time for Online Education before COVID-19.



Internal Influences: SIS & CVC-OEI Home/Teaching College Exchange

- **Minor Impact**
 - MPC can pursue becoming a home college and a teaching college, but SIS is a limiting factor.
 - Home College: MPC students can take courses at other participating CCC's via the exchange without applying.
 - Teaching College: Participating CCC students can take courses at MPC via the exchange without applying.
 - The Exchange: the place where students can register for courses at other participating CCC's that are home and teaching colleges.
- The addition of our new ERP: Ellucian Banner can potentially solve this in the future.



External Influences: CVC-OEI Local Certification

- Minor Impact
 - The CVC-OEI have changed their requirements for MPC to participate in the exchange and be locally certified.
 - All online MPC courses could be listed in the exchange for other CCC students to register for.
 - Locally certified: The CVC-OEI will allow MPC to submit approved courses to exchange and are then placed higher on the list of courses for other participating CCC's students to register for.
- Hopefully we can pursue local certification soon!
