Review of draft language for MPC GE Standard – Ethnic Studies:

Per Title 5, these courses can only be ETNC and those cross-listed with ETNC; As Faculty revise and review courses, ETNC Core Competencies may be altered (they do not need to be transferred verbatim from CCC model); Impact of revisions to MPC GE Standards on our existing Area F/Intercultural Studies – if this Area is not retained, consider integrating existing description/ideology into Humanities or Wellness, or into the MPC GE Philosophy statement; Consider also whether we wish to keep Area E – Wellness and Career Exploration – as they exist currently
