Failure to complete and file all pages of the Form R-4 and verification that the EADA Report has been filed by November 1 will result in the forfeiture of all completed contests until the form is received by the CCCAA Office. Verification can be provided by submitting an electronic copy of the completion certificate available on the bottom of the Survey Navigation /Status screen of the EADA by the individual who submitted/locked the online EADA Survey or a screenshot of the EADA webpage which states the EADA Survey was locked. The college uses feedback from students, athletic coaches, as well as survey results from college applicants to determine interest in intercollegiate athletics. For the past decade, the college has used a supplemental survey in CCCApply to gauge interest among college applicants in intercollegiate athletics. Applicants indicate their interest in specific sports and their ability level in the sports in which they are interested. Students who identify as "intermediate" or "advanced" in a particular sport are included in the counts of interested students on the following page. Students who identify as "beginner" in a particular sport are not included in the counts on the following page.

Results from the supplemental survey in CCCApply from July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023 indicate interest in two women's sports not currently offered at the college: (1) swimming/diving, and (2) soccer. Each of these areas is discussed below.

(1) Swimming/diving
The college has monitored the survey results related to women's swimming/diving on an annual basis. Aside from the 2014-15 year, there has been interest in women's swimming since the athletic interest survey was fully implemented in the 2012-13 year. In response to the survey results, the college hosted two meetings since 2014 to better gauge interest in women's swimming. Students who expressed interest in women's swimming via the interest survey were invited to the meeting. In addition, the Athletic Director also extended the invitation to the entire student population via an email sent to all students enrolled at the college. The meeting was also advertised through flyers that were placed at strategic locations throughout the campus. The first meeting, held in spring 2014, drew only two interested students. The second meeting, held in fall 2019, was to gauge interest in women's swimming or in women's beach/sand volleyball. We used the same advertisement process for the fall 2019 meeting that was used in spring 2014. Twenty-two students attended the fall 2019 meeting with about half interested in beach/sand volleyball and the pandemic, and as a result, the college did not monitor nor report survey results on interest in intercollegiate athletics. During 2021-22 and 2022-23, there were 13 and 12 women applicants, respectively, who expressed interest in swimming/diving. The college will continue to monitor survey results and will host an interest meeting should the

(2) Soccer The college established a women's soccer team in fall 2008. Interest in women's soccer, measured by the interest survey, has been strong and consistent since the survey was implemented in the 2012-13 year. However, actual participation has waned in recent years, and the college had to temporarily suspend the team due to an insufficient number of players. The college had planned to host an interest meeting in spring of 2023 to better gauge interest for reinstating women's soccer; however, a more thorough examination of the 31 interested women reported in the 2022 Form R-4 revealed that only 8 identified as "advanced". Similarly, only 7 of the 28 women who expressed interest during 2022-23 identified as "advanced". The college will continue to monitor survey results for this women's sport, and continue to disaggregate survey results by ability level.
