GENT 404A	GENT 404A, <i>The Roman Republic and Rise of Empire</i> (500 B.C14 A.D.), is a revision of GENT 404. Previously this course covered the time period of 300 B.C. – 400 A.D. in two weeks. By expanding the courses into two separate courses (GENT 404A and 404B), Gentrain will be able to address the Roman Republic and the Roman Empire in separate classes. This course will allow for the addition of one more two-week Gentrain session in the fall semester. This course has been developed to meet the requirements for an Older Adult course. If the Chancellor's Office approves this course, it will be used as a model to develop additional non-credit Gentrain courses.
