<p><b>Discussion</b> <b>Experimental courses</b></p> <p><b>Susan Walter</b></p>	<p>Susan distributed a handout listing the course descriptions which have been developed to publish in the catalog for Experimental Courses. Experimental Courses will be numbered 97, 197, 297, 397 in any discipline. The approval process will be the same as for other courses. They will first have to go through CAC and then be approved by the Board. A suggestion was made that there be a CAC subcommittee to expedite the development of Experimental Courses.</p>	<p>FYI</p> <p>Susan will add advisories of Eligibility for ENGL 111 and 112 or ENSL 110 and 155 to 97, 197, and 297 descriptions and CSU transferability to the 97 description.</p>
<p><b>Discussion</b> <b>Distance Education – hybrid issues (BUSI 1A)</b></p> <p><b>Susan Walter</b></p>	<p>Susan brought to the committee’s attention the fact that the Distance Education Form does not accommodate hybrid courses (courses that are less than 50% online). This will call for the development of a new form for Hybrid courses. It was suggested that it might be possible to modify the current Distance Education Form by adding a Method of Delivery selection box for either Hybrid or fully Distance Education courses. The proposing faculty member could then check the appropriate box. Sharon Colton has suggested having a Distance Education Workshop for faculty.</p>	<p>Discussion will continue.</p>
<p><b>Discussion</b> <b>Gentrain courses – older adult/special topics</b></p> <p><b>Susan Walter</b></p>	<p>The committee discussed the need to determine the best way of categorizing noncredit Gentrain courses in the future. Susan distributed a handout listing Curriculum modes (dated 9/26/06) and guidelines for Older Adult non-credit courses. Gentrain courses are currently coded as Noncredit Basic Skills, which is not an appropriate designation. Alan Haffa will submit a new noncredit Gentrain course to the Chancellor’s Office under the Older Adult designation. The committee discussed several options for Gentrain if the CO does not approve this noncredit category. The possibility of having Gentrain courses redesigned as non-transferable, degree applicable credit courses was discussed at length</p>	<p>Discussion will continue.</p>
